There have been some burglaries and break in to sheds which we have been busy with. We have been in contact with all parties and house to house enquiries have been completed. There have also been a couple of ASB (anti-social behaviour) incidents which we have been working in conjunction with partner agencies. We are ensuring that we attend all our communities and although you may not always see us we make sure we get to as many villages as possible.

Although our officers are mainly based in the rural there are occasions when they have to help out our colleagues. Romsey town had a dramatic incident that PC Pugh and PC Batt attended. The initial report described a male with a knife. On attendance the male ran from police. PC Pugh gave chase and after a challenge and deployment of Taser the male was detained on suspicion of being in possession of an offensive weapon and taken to Southampton police station. He was found to be wanted for other outstanding offences.

This month has been very busy as Covid-19 restrictions begin to lift and a new sense of normality returns. Our officers have lots of enquiries and investigations on-going from the end of 2021 as well as newly reported incidents which are also under investigation.

Unfortunately some of the Parish Council meetings were not able to take place so we have booked ourselves into February's agenda. We look forward to meeting you.

Neighbourhood Priorities

Theft from vehicles: This continues to be something that is a continuing trend. Again, please leave any valuables at home wherever possible and lock vehicles.

Theft from sheds and outbuildings: Please remain vigilant of items stored within your property. Pushbikes and power tools are often the items of choice but anything they can take easily, that is of value, will tempt them. Please lock, padlock and/or alarm your outbuildings and security mark items wherever possible, so if or when they are found we can return them to their rightful owners.

Burglaries: We have had 3 reported this month. One was on business premises and two were residential properties. Please report any suspicious activity to us. The Blue Lamp Trusts Bobby Van scheme is available for advice or click on the link below for further information.

Pushbikes can also be registered on a national database via The National Cycle Database | BikeRegister. This records the details of the pushbike including the make, model and frame number and allows you to upload a photo. A pdf can be printed out of all your details for you to take with you.

Community Engagement: PCSOs Craig and Marie have been out and about visiting schools, seeing local business owners and attending community events now that Covid-19 restrictions are easing. The beat surgeries will be starting back up again at the beginning of April as the weather improves and begins to warm up. This is due to holding many of these outside, wherever possible, to remain ever vigilant and cautious.

We have seen a rise in poaching/hare coursing being reported. We have had several sightings of vehicles acting suspiciously and would ask anyone to contact us as soon as possible.


